

WorkSafe C6 Licence Course Details

Course Name: TLILIC0023 Licence to operate a slewing mobile crane (up to 60 tonnes)

WorkSafe Licence: **WorkSafe High Risk Work Licence- C6**

Duration: **Option 1:** 4 X 8 Hour Days (plus at home learning requirement.) 2.5 days (approx. 20 hours) of training, followed by 1.5 days (approx. 12 hours) of assessment. Max 5 students in a class.
Option 2: 5 X 8 Hour Days (plus at home learning requirement.) 3 days (approx. 24 hours) of training, followed by 1 day (approx. 8 hours) of assessment. Max 8 students in a class (4 students assessed on Day 4, the remaining 4 assessed on Day 5).
(Training and assessment day times can vary due to a number of reasons including but not limited to individual student requirements on the day of training and assessment)

Delivery method: Option 1 - Blended delivery – This is a combination of Self-Paced Learning and Face-to-face delivery/assessment. Students are provided with a Learner Guide and Activity Book at time of booking and must complete the Activity Book (Part A) before attending the face-to-face component of the course. Self-Paced Learning requires approximately 6 hours of at home reading & writing.
Option 2 - Face-to-face delivery: All training and assessment (both theory and practical) is conducted at GWPT during the course. *We highly recommend that you read the Learner Guide and complete the activity book at home (may take approximately 6 hours) before attending 5-day face-to-face training.*

Location: Go Workplace Training (RTO Registration Code: 22464) has training venues in Clayton and Dandenong South, Victoria and can deliver this training course onsite.

Dress Requirements: Safety boots, High visibility vests, long pants and hard hats. *(GWPT can supply Whistles, hard hats & gloves; however, participants may bring their own if they are in safe condition)*

Equipment Requirements:

- One slewing mobile crane for 4 days course and two slewing mobile cranes for 5 days course with a maximum rated capacity of between 20 tonnes & 60 tonnes, which meets Australian Standard AS1418. Where practicable, the crane to be fitted with a fly jib.
- Mobile crane operational service logbooks and crane load charts, manufacturers operation manual.
- A person licensed to perform dogging work to assist in slinging the load and directing the crane operator in moving the load.
- The following loads:
 - A load of >50% of the Rated Capacity of the crane with a boom length of >75%
 - Stillage containing at least 10 scaffolding standards or containing a load of steel pipes of equivalent weight that requires a dogger to sling
 - An Asymmetric load that requires a dogger to sling
 - A round load with a minimum diameter of 300mm & minimum length of 3m that requires a dogger to sling
- An obstacle course which allows the safe mobiling of the slewing mobile crane & for a 180 degree slew.

When training and assessment is held at Go Workplace Training's facility all equipment and materials (including PPE) required for the course is provided.

Material Required: Go Workplace Training provides all other material including Learner Guide, workbook, reference materials, assessment paperwork and administrative documentation.

GWPT Selection Criteria: There are no formal entry requirements/pre-requisites noted within the training package for this unit of competency. GWPT selection criteria includes the following:

- Participants must be at least 18 years old.
- Can use the English language at a level that enables the safe performance of high risk work and complete the required course assessments. Students must also be able to understand the provided texts; comprehend the training in a classroom environment and be able to respond to short answer questions in English. A sample of the text and example of short answer questions are available on request. We recommend that all participants complete a Learning, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Skills Assessment at the time of booking, and to discuss any specific learning needs at this time. If the

LLND test is not returned during the period outlined in the Confirmation Email, and the participant is assessed during the course as not meeting the LLND requirements of the course, the full fee remains payable.

- Participants are required to have general good health and fitness and any pre-existing medical conditions that will affect the training must be disclosed prior to attending.
- To obtain a WorkSafe Licence, participants must reside in Victoria or, if residence is elsewhere, have reasonable grounds for applying for the licence in Victoria. If you do not reside in Victoria, WorkSafe may require you to provide them with evidence of your reason for requiring a Victorian HRW Licence.
- If you are not an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or Australian permanent resident, you must ensure that your visa permits you to study in Australia.

Course Description:

This course has both theory and practical components. For a 5-day course, training and assessment requirements include:

- Day 1, 2 and 3 - Training and assessment for the unit of competency – covering the requirements of the training product, using Activity Book and associated handouts (as applicable to the course), and
- Day 4 and 5 - The final WorkSafe Victoria high risk work licence assessment, using the National Assessment Instruments (conducted after successful completion of the unit of competency).

The duration of each course & time allocated to training may vary according to the size of the class, and experience/needs of the individual students. Within the timeframe, different amounts of training will be provided for each identified student based on their specific learning needs, prior knowledge, skills and experience.

WorkSafe's approved National Assessment Instrument (licence test) - Under closed book assessment conditions, students will be required to complete a:

- Written test with 120 questions, 114 answered correctly (95%)
- Calculations test with 13 questions, all answered correctly (100%).
- Practical assessment

At the successful completion of this course, participants will be able to safely operate a slewing crane (up to 60 tonne capacity) and be able to apply a working knowledge of the OH&S and regulatory requirements in accordance with WorkSafe standards. This includes conducting Pre-Start Checks; operating a Slewing Crane (up to 60 tonne capacity) in a safe manner and correctly shutting down the machine.

Outcome:

At the successful completion of this unit of competency requirements, participants will receive a Statement of Attainment for that unit. This is not a WorkSafe licence for the applicable licence class. Once participants successfully complete licence assessment, they will receive an email from WorkSafe containing a link to access a Notice of Assessment (which acts as a temporary licence for 60 days from the original assessment day). Participants are required to lodge their Notice of Assessment on the My WorkSafe Portal or at Australia Post and pay the WorkSafe Licence fee within the 60 days from the original licence assessment day to obtain the actual Licence from WorkSafe. Competence in this unit, does not in itself result in a high-risk work licence.

RPL/ Credit Transfer

Individuals possessing a valid plant licence and recent operational experience (within the last 6 months) with the relevant machinery can apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) to obtain the related competency unit. Operating slewing mobile cranes (up to 60 tonnes) in Victoria requires a WorkSafe licence. Therefore, any previous experience operating this equipment without the necessary licence is not eligible for recognition. Credit Transfer is available for an equivalent unit of competency.

Employment and Learning Pathways

HRW C6 licences are required to operate slewing mobile cranes (up to 60 tonnes) in Australian workplaces. C6 licence will also enable you to operate plant that fall under the following licence categories: Slewing mobile crane up to 20 tonnes (C2), vehicle loading crane (CV), Non slewing mobile crane greater than 3 tonne (CN), Non-slewing telehandlers (TV) & Reach stacker (RS). Students who satisfactorily complete this course may consider undertaking other Crane licencing.
