

### WorkSafe DG Licence Course Details

<b>Course Name &amp; Code:</b>	CPCCLDG3001 Licence to perform dogging
<b>Duration and delivery method:</b>	<p>4 x 8-hour days at the training organisation + 8 hours of at home learning (<i>Students are provided with a Learner Guide and Activity Book at the time of booking and must complete the Activity Book – Part A before attending the face-to-face component of the course. Self-Paced Learning requires approximately 8 hours of at home reading &amp; writing.</i>) (Blended delivery) OR</p> <p>5 x 8-hour days (Face-to-face only - All training and assessment takes place face-to-face.) - <i>We highly recommend that you read the Learner Guide and complete the activity book at home (may take approximately 8 hours) before attending 5-day face-to-face training.</i></p> <p><i>Training and assessment day times can vary due to a number of reasons including but not limited to individual student requirements on the day of training and assessment.)</i></p>
<b>Location:</b>	Go Workplace Training (RTO Registration Code: 22464) has training venues in Clayton and Dandenong South in Victoria and offers this training course onsite.
<b>Dress Requirements:</b>	Safety boots, High visibility vests, long pants and hard hats. ( <i>GWPT can supply Whistles, hard hats &amp; gloves; however, participants may bring their own if they are in safe condition</i> )
<b>Equipment Requirements:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Site and task specific hazard control measures such as barriers to create pedestrian zones, signage and the like.</li><li>• A slewing mobile crane of at least 7 tonnes maximum capacity and that meets state/territory regulatory requirements.</li><li>• A licensed crane operator (<i>who has held their licence for a minimum of 2 years</i>).</li><li>• The following loads will be available:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Stillage containing at least 10 scaffolding standards or loose steel pipes (<i>weight of 200kg of more</i>)</li><li>○ 10 loose steel pipes (<i>of at least 2m length, that need wrapping</i>)</li><li>○ Steel plate (<i>at least 1.5m x 2m x 25mm</i>)</li><li>○ Round load (<i>minimum weight 500kg, not less than 5 metres long, not less than 300mm diameter</i>)</li><li>○ Uneven load (<i>minimum weight 2 tonne, requiring slinging</i>)</li></ul></li><li>• Tagline rope (at least 16 mm).</li><li>• Sufficient (not less than 10 mm) natural or synthetic rope to complete the four knots, bends and hitches.</li><li>• Faulty lifting equipment and gear for training purposes.</li><li>• Hazard controls (both workplace and task specific.)</li><li>• workplace information and records, including:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ equipment and maintenance checklists</li><li>○ record system for service and maintenance history</li><li>○ incident reports</li><li>○ workplace procedures, including emergency plan</li><li>○ equipment manuals and manufacturer specifications.</li></ul></li><li>• As a minimum, the following items will be available in a condition which would comply with the requirements of the relevant state/territory legislation:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ flexible steel wire rope (FSWR) sling</li><li>○ synthetic sling</li><li>○ chain sling (including shortener)</li><li>○ spreader bar or lifting beam</li><li>○ shackles</li><li>○ eyebolts</li><li>○ plate clamps.</li></ul></li><li>• Fixed channel two way radio <b>and</b> whistles</li><li>• An area which enables each load to be directed through at least 180 degrees of the cranes slewing radius</li></ul> <p>When training and assessment takes place at Go Workplace Training's facility, all equipment (including PPE) and materials will be provided.</p>

**GWPT Selection Criteria:**

There are no formal entry requirements/pre-requisites noted within the training package for this unit of competency. GWPT selection criteria includes the following:

- Participants must be at least 18 years old.
- Can use the English language at a level that enables the safe performance of high-risk work.
- Students must also be able to understand the provided texts; comprehend the training in a classroom environment and be able to respond to short answer questions in English. A sample of the text and example of short answer questions are available on request. We recommend that all participants complete a Learning, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Skills Assessment at the time of booking, and to discuss any specific learning needs at this time. If the LLND test is not returned during the period outlined in the Confirmation Email, and the participant is assessed during the course as not meeting the LLND requirements of the course, the full course fee remains payable.
- Participants are required to have general good health and fitness and any pre-existing medical conditions that will affect the training must be disclosed prior to attending.
- To obtain a WorkSafe Licence, participants must reside in Victoria or, if residence is elsewhere, have reasonable grounds for applying for the licence in Victoria. If you do not reside in Victoria, WorkSafe may require you to provide them with evidence of your reason for requiring a Victorian HRW Licence.
- If you are not an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or Australian permanent resident, you must ensure that your visa permits you to study in Australia.

**Course Description:**

This course has both theory and practical components. For a 5-day course, training and assessment requirements include:

- Day 1, 2 and 3 - Training and assessment for the unit of competency – covering the requirements of the training product, using Activity Book and associated handouts (as applicable to the course), and
- Day 4 and 5 - The final WorkSafe Victoria high risk work licence assessment, using the National Assessment Instruments (conducted after successful completion of the unit of competency).

The duration of each course & time allocated to training may vary according to the size of the class, and experience/needs of the individual students. Within the timeframe, different amounts of training will be provided for each identified student based on their specific learning needs, prior knowledge, skills and experience.

Licence Assessment is conducted using WorkSafe's approved National Assessment Instrument and practical tasks. Under closed book assessment conditions, students are required to complete 71 short answer questions and a calculations test (National Assessment Instrument). Students also undertake a practical assessment (National Assessment Instrument). At the successful completion of this course, participants will be able to perform dogging to the WorkSafe Assessment Standards. Participants will also be able to identify the safety requirements for all dogging activities and their working environments.

**Outcome:**

At the successful completion of this unit of competency requirements, participants will receive a Statement of Attainment for that unit. This is not a WorkSafe licence for the applicable licence class. Once participants successfully complete licence assessment, they will receive an email from WorkSafe containing a link to access a Notice of Assessment (which acts as a temporary licence for 60 days from the original assessment day). Participants are required to lodge their Notice of Assessment on the My WorkSafe Portal or at Australia Post and pay the WorkSafe Licence fee within the 60 days from the original licence assessment day to obtain the actual Licence from WorkSafe. Competence in this unit, does not in itself result in a high-risk work licence.

**RPL/ Credit Transfer**

Individuals possessing a valid licence and recent dogging work experience (within the last 6 months) with the relevant machinery can apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) to obtain the related competency unit. Performing dogging work in Victoria requires a WorkSafe licence. Therefore, any previous experience operating this equipment without the necessary licence is not eligible for recognition. Credit Transfer is available for an equivalent unit of competency.

**Employment and Learning Pathways**

Students successfully completing this unit, will hold a WorkSafe High Risk Work licence for "Licence to perform Dogging". Students will be licenced to perform "dogging" tasks on a work site; including slinging techniques, selecting & inspecting lifting gear & directing the crane operator in the movement of loads. Students who satisfactorily complete this course may consider undertaking other nationally recognised courses in construction, civil infrastructure or similar areas such as crane licensing and rigging courses.
