

WorkSafe RI Licence Course Details

Course Name & Code:	CPCCLRG3002 - Licence to perform rigging intermediate level
WorkSafe Licence:	WorkSafe Licence Class - RI
Duration:	4 x 8-hour days at Go Workplace Training + Self-study and completion of an activity book at home (Blended delivery). Training and assessment day times can vary due to a number of reasons including but not limited to individual student requirements on the day of training and assessment.
Delivery method	Blended delivery – This is a combination of Self-Paced Learning (approximately 6 hours) and Face-to-face delivery/assessment. Students are provided with a Learner Guide and Activity Book at time of booking and must complete the Activity Book – Part A before attending the face-to-face component of the course [2 days (approx. 16 hours) of face-to-face training, followed by approx. 2 days of assessment.]
Location:	Go Workplace Training (RTO Registration Code: 22464) has a training venue in Dandenong South, Victoria.
Dress Requirements:	Safety shoes (ie: steel cap), High visibility vests, long pants and hard hats (<i>GWPT can supply Whistles, hard hats & gloves, however participants may bring their own, if they are in safe condition</i>)
Equipment Requirements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Site and task specific hazard control measures such as barriers to create pedestrian zones, signage and the like.• A crane, to lift & move the required loads & a licensed crane operator (<i>who has held their licence for a minimum of 2 years</i>).• An elevated work platform with a boom length over 11 metres & a licenced operator• Site plans, engineer details, structural plans, manufacturer instructions, for rigging activities & equipment• A range of defective rigging & lifting equipment, for the purposes of training & identification.• Equipment and tools required to install & dismantle rigging tasks, including but not limited to, a free-standing tower and three slabs not less than four metres high, not less than two metres wide, and not less than one and a half tonnes in weight.• Safety harnesses, lanyards in safe working order that meets AS1891• Inertia reels, static lines and anchorage points safe working order that meets AS4488. <p>When training and assessment takes place at Go Workplace Training’s Dandenong South facility, all equipment (including PPE) and materials will be provided.</p>
Material Required:	Go Workplace Training provides all other material including Learner Guide, workbook, reference materials, assessment paperwork and administrative documentation.
Pre-requisite unit	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• CPCCLRG3001 Licence to perform rigging basic level.• This requirement may be met by either the successful completion of the unit CPCCLRG3001 Licence to perform rigging basic level or holding a valid licence for rigging basic level.
GWPT Selection Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Participants must have a current HRW Licence to perform basic rigging• Participants must be at least 18 years old.• Can use the English language at a level that enables the safe performance of high risk work. Students must also be able to understand the provided texts; comprehend the training in a classroom environment and be able to respond to short answer questions in English. A sample of the text and example of short answer questions are available on request. We recommend that all participants complete a Learning, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Skills Assessment at the time of booking, and to discuss any specific learning needs at this time. <p>If the LLND test is not returned during the period outlined in the Confirmation Email, and the participant is assessed during the course as not meeting the LLND requirements of the course, the full course fee remains payable.</p>

- Participants are required to have general good health and fitness and any pre-existing medical conditions that will affect the training must be disclosed prior to attending.
- To obtain a WorkSafe Licence, participants must reside in Victoria or, if residence is elsewhere, have reasonable grounds for applying for the licence in Victoria. If you do not reside in Victoria, WorkSafe may require you to provide them with evidence of your reason for requiring a Victorian HRW Licence.
- If you are not an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or Australian permanent resident, you must ensure that your visa permits you to study in Australia.

Course Description:

This course has both theory and practical components. Students enrolled in a 4-day course are expected to complete Learner Guide reading & Activity book theory questions (Part A) prior to face-to-face training of both components. For a 4-day course, face to face training and assessment requirements include:

- Day 1 and 2 - Training and assessment for the unit of competency – covering the requirements of the training product, using Activity Book and associated handouts (as applicable to the course), and
- Day 3 and 4 - The final WorkSafe Victoria high risk work licence assessment, using the National Assessment Instruments (conducted after successful completion of the unit of competency).

The duration of each course & time allocated to training may vary according to the size of the class, and experience/needs of the individual students. Within the timeframe, different amounts of training will be provided for each identified student based on their specific learning needs, prior knowledge, skills and experience.

WorkSafe's approved National Assessment Instrument (licence assessment): Under closed book assessment conditions, students will be required to complete a:

- Written test with 70 questions, 66 answered correctly (95%)
- Calculations test with 5 questions, all answered correctly (100%).
- Practical assessment (six tasks). Students undertake a practical assessment, in groups of 3-4 team members.

At the successful completion of this course, participants will be able to perform intermediate rigging to the WorkSafe Assessment Standards. Participants will also be able to identify the safety requirements for rigging activities and their working environments.

Outcome:

At the successful completion of this unit of competency requirements, participants will receive a Statement of Attainment for that unit. This is not a WorkSafe licence for the applicable licence class. Once participants successfully complete licence assessment, they will receive an email from WorkSafe containing a link to access a Notice of Assessment (which acts as a temporary licence for 60 days from the original assessment day). Participants are required to lodge their Notice of Assessment on the My WorkSafe Portal or at Australia Post and pay the WorkSafe Licence fee within the 60 days from the original licence assessment day to obtain the actual Licence from WorkSafe. Competence in this unit, does not in itself result in a high-risk work licence.

RPL/ Credit Transfer

Individuals possessing a relevant valid rigging licence and recent intermediate rigging work experience (within the last 6 months) can apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) to obtain the related competency unit. Performing intermediate rigging in Victoria requires a WorkSafe licence. Therefore, any previous experience performing this job without the necessary licence is not eligible for recognition. Credit Transfer is available for an equivalent unit of competency.

Employment and Learning Pathways

Students can be licenced to perform intermediate rigging tasks involving jibs and self-climbing hoists, cranes, conveyors, dredges and excavators, tilt slabs, demolition of structures or plant, multiple lifts. These tasks may be performed within the construction, mining and drilling industries. Students who satisfactorily complete this course may consider undertaking rigging advanced level courses. Students may also consider undertaking crane licencing. Go Workplace Training do not currently offer advanced rigging courses, we do offer crane licencing.
